The ecologícal Corrídor of Saínt-Jean

You are in a diffuse ecological corridor, where many species can feed, move and reproduce.

It ensures ecological continuity between the valleys of Grande and Petite Blourde, which are biodiversity reservoirs of regional interest.

With the use of space in hunting routes comes an agriculture recess and a landscape closure. This phenomenon is accelerating with the development of copses and mixed woods of hardwoods and conifers, done to make the land profitable.

With wild boars, deer, hinds, game birds, the species of ordinary biodiversity are multiple. In season, you will discover many orchid species.

Before the wood 'Bois des Rafles', a beautiful panorama emerges towards the east.

For your safety, do not leave the trail and keep dogs on a leash.
